

The history of education, and language education not least, has been a history of contrasted metaphors, by means of which the often invisible processes of learning are conceptualized and modelled. Over time we have witnessed a shift from cognitive models to more socially-embedded – even ecological – ones. Drawing on selected entries in The New A-Z of ELT (Macmillan 2017) I aim to track these changes and suggest their implications for ELT.

Scott Thornbury is a teacher and teacher educator, with over 30 years' experience in English language teaching, and an MA from the University of Reading. His previous experience includes teaching and teacher training in Egypt, UK, Spain (where he lives), and in his native New Zealand. My career trajectory is now in a phase of gentle descent.

We'll also see how nothing that releases the dyslexic learning potential holds non-dyslexics back.

Martin has been involved in dyslexia research and training for 20 years. He's spoken internationally on the subject, presented to Government Ministers at Britain's Treasury, contributed to international publications, and initiated the UK's national Dyslexia In Business Award. He runs teacher training courses at York Associates, and gives training on international perspectives of SEN at Leeds City College. He runs the website DyslexiaBytes.Org.
